A prominent organic chemist, Dr. Evans obtained his Ph.D. in 1990 at Cambridge and in 2006 was appointed Professor of Chemistry and Heath Harrison Chair of Organic Chemistry at the University of Liverpool.

He assumed his role on July 1, 2012.

Former Médecins Sans Frontières head appointed to global health chair



James Orbinski was named holder of the CIGI Chair in Global Health by Wilfrid Laurier University, as of Sept. 1. Dr. Orbinski is the former international president of Médecins Sans Frontières (Doctors Without Borders), where he accepted the Nobel

Peace Prize on behalf of the organization in 1999. Dr. Orbinski will be affiliated with Laurier's school of international policy and governance, the health sciences program in the faculty of science, and the Balsillie School of International Affairs. The latter is a partnership involving Laurier, the Centre for International Governance Innovation (CIGI) and the University of Waterloo. In addition, Dr. Orbinski will serve as director of the Africa Initiative at CIGI and as senior adviser to CIGI's vice-president of programs. Most recently, Dr. Orbinski was a professor at the University of Toronto medical school, where he served as chair of global health at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health. He was also a fellow at the Munk Centre for International Studies and practised medicine at St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto.
